Capital Under Siege, But Pastors Left Unharmed

We are sure that anyone reading this has already seen numerous news reports of the recent uptick in chaos and gang-related violence in Haiti on TV or the internet. Whenever world events reach the magnitude to be included in our "commercial 30-minute news menu", you can be assured that it is extreme!

Janice and I, however, want to emphasize the following: The vast majority of the violence is limited to the Capital City of Port-Au-Prince. The men and ministries that we currently work with are to the north of that region, and are by contrast experiencing a "relative calm" most days. We have been in touch with each one, and THANK GOD for their safety and the ability of their churches to function. Please, please...continue to pray for each one of them and for the country in general. We **have** to believe in and hope for The Lord's deliverance and their future!



Pastor Lucien Jean-Marie and Louisa

These two continue to faithfully serve Beracha Baptist Church in Bon-Repos, just north of the capital. Lucien says that they need to stay at home and off the streets as much as possible, but there is a small store nearby where they can find basic provisions. Sadly, as is the case throughout the country, all is very expensive. People continue to attend their church, and the children come to SS class where they find mangoes to eat, even though they are not ripe.

Garry and his family continue to serve in The Dominican Republic, where they fled for safety. Garry is staying very busy teaching at a Bible Institute while authoring two books—One on the Christian's response to homosexuality and the other regarding the Bible and the topic of slavery. He is also doing distance training online to pastors both in The DR and in Haiti.

The three men that serve in St. Marc are led by Pastor Leon, who further serves as the national leader of the churches under the Conservative Baptist Mission. The three of them preach and teach in various capacities in each other's churches. We are happy to report that, at least in that city, there is a relative freedom from gangs. Any travel out of St. Marc to other churches for weddings and meetings, however, requires great caution and sometimes travel by boat to avoid the roads.



Pastor Jean Gaunick Louis and Manougka

Pastor Gaunick and his family continue to live in a suburb of Montreal in Quebec, Canada where, like Garry, they fled for safety. They rent a small apartment there, and Gaunick works for an auto parts warehouse to help provide, but it is not enough to meet all the expense of life in Canada. He, along with two other pastors, are

renting a place where they are planting a church. God help and bless them ALL!
